Police, Library, Government Representatives Update

- Xander Marquez on behalf of Colonial Heights Library
 - Seed Library (https://www.saclibrary.org/Books-Media/Specialty-Checkouts/Seed-Libraries-en)
 - Free program
 - Meant to introduce growing/gardening to communities, especially in food deserts
 - Staff, Friends of the library, and volunteers help package the seeds
 - The seed library cannot take donated seeds due to copyright laws on seeds.
 - Neighbor Question: How are the seeds sourced?
 - Purchased (i.e. Amazon)
 - Community Garden
 - Colonial Heights is one of the few libraries that has a community garden.
 - New CHNA committee Colonial Library Garden Club to meet and tend to the garden
 - Neighbor Question: Has the library considered bringing back the spay & neuter clinics?
 - 4 R Friends was the organization who previously provided the service. Their organizational focus has shifted to pets of the

homeless. Library is open to continuing the program if another organization could provide the service.

- Philip Norton on behalf of Councilmember Eric Guerra
 - City facing a budget shortfall of about \$58 million
 - Currently at the beginning of budget negotiations
 - Bus Rapid Transit
 - Approved at the Sacramento City Council meeting on April 9th,
 Stockton Boulevard Multimodal Partnership and Bus Rapid Transit
 (BRT) Corridor Project
 - Higher speed bus line transit
 - Will help to access federal funding
 - Stockton Boulevard Plan
 - Feedback on the plan has been extended through May 15th
 - Plan can be found: https://www.cityofsacramento.gov/community-development/planning/major-projects/stockton-blvd-plan
 - Converting the 21st Ave median to a park
 - The median is currently under the Public Works department and has stop being watered while in a drought
 - Potential pilot program: very Eastern section of the media, planting a natural look with combination of plants and grass
 - The Parks department has added 7 new parks under their purview.
 No additional staffing to man the extra work.
 - Opening Saturday March 16th

Find Out Farms (https://findoutfarms.com)

- Half acre farm (4712 Parker Ave, Sacramento, CA 95820)
- Community Fruit Program
 - Sacramento's urban gleaning program
 - o 2023: 23,000 pounds of fruit harvested
 - o Program is completely volunteer and donation based
- Educational Outreach & Engagement
 - Seed sharing (fruits, veggies, native plants)
 - Nature Nerds
 - Presentations by experts in their fields for an adult audience during the summer
 - Potentially a tomato tasting event (like wine tasting)
- Community News Alert: Fruit Fly Quarantine
 - o https://www.cdfa.ca.gov/plant/off/regulation.html
 - Homes within the quarantine limits are not to move fruits or vegetables from their home

Root 64

- One acre farm (4971 64th St, Sacramento, CA 95820)
- No till market garden, not a certified organic farm but uses regenerative gardening practices
- 2018 was first production
- 2024 farmstand dates still to be announced (typically open Saturdays 9am-12pm)
- Accepts cash, credit cards, Venmo, CalFresh EBT (unlimited Market Match)

- Half acre farm in Sacramento (4505 Roosevelt Ave, Sacramento, CA 95820) and additional location in Amador County
- Liberated Harvest
 - Subscription programs: eggs and produce
- Urban Roots Initiative
 - Sow and Grow Saturdays
 - Soapmaking Classes


